

Alexandru Gavrilovici

Alexandru Gavrilovici was born in Brasov, Romania. Upon completion of the Music Academy in Bucharest, he continued his studies with Leonid Kogan, Nathan Milstein and Corrado Romano as well as participating in classes in Music Phenomenology by Maestro Sergiu Celibidache in Mainz and Munich. During his studies, Alexandru Gavrilovici received various awards in Romania as well as internationally.

His special field of interest lies with important composers of the 20th century, including Bernd Alois Zimmermann, Arthur Honegger and Karl Amadeus Hartmann. Alexandru Gavrilovici is a renowned soloist as well as teacher at several international academies and festivals, foremost the Yehudi Menuhin Academy in Gstaad, Switzerland and is the founder of the Summer Academy Sighisoara, Romania.

He has performed as soloist with such conductors as Gustav Kuhn, Peter Maag, Dimitrij Kitajenko and Andrej Borejko as well as chamber music with Juerg Wyttenbach and Hans Heinz Schneeberger. Along with soloing in recitals, Alexandru Gavrilovici has been performing as first concertmaster in the Bern Symphony Orchestra since 1979. He resides in Bern, Switzerland.
